CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Norton called the meeting to order at 2 p.m. and John Stack led the Pledge of Allegiance.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Mr. Sheffield informed the committee that if anyone has a comment and does not wish to speak to email Marci Larson at <u>mlarson@northfloridatpo.com</u>. Ms. Larson will read the comment for the record during the *Public Comment* portion of the meeting.

► A. <u>APPROVE THE APRIL 7, 2021 MEETING MINUTES</u>

Chairman Norton asked for approval of the minutes of the April Citizens Advisory Committee meeting.

• Jim Robinson asked that the minutes be revised to reflect that Eugene Yerkes seconded all motions.

Thomas Martin moved to approve the April 7, 2021 minutes as amended; Eugene Yerkes seconded; motion unanimously carried.

► B. FDOT REQUESTS AMENDING THE FY 2020/21 THROUGH FY 2024/25 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP)

Autumn Martinage presented the amendment to the Transportation Improvement Program for FY 2020/21 through FY 2024/25.

Ms. Martinage asked for questions. There were no questions at this time.

Thomas Martin moved to approve the FDOT's request to amend the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for FY 2020/21 through FY 2024/25; Eugene Yerkes seconded; motion unanimously carried.

C. <u>AMENDMENT OF THE UNIFIED PLANNING WORK PROGRAM (UPWP) FOR</u> <u>FY 2020/21 THROUGH FY 2021/22 (ADDITION OF SECOND YEAR</u> <u>PROJECTS)</u>

Denise Bunnewith presented the amendment of the Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) for FY 2020/21 through FY 2021/22.

Section 5, Special Projects, is being amended with Resolution 2021-3 to add the following:

- Task 5.17 Smart North Florida Report Card North Florida TPO

- Task 5.19 8th Street Corridor Study Jacksonville

Ms. Bunnewith asked for questions.

• John Stack wanted information about the deleted project to design and construct a new maintenance building at the airport in Hilliard.

Ms. Bunnewith responded that project is in FDOT's Work Program.

• Jim Robinson wanted to know the estimated budget for the list of studies.

Ms. Bunnewith responded that each study ranges between \$80,000 - \$100,000.

Mr. Sheffield commented that it is usually in the range of \$1.2 - \$1.3 million as a whole.

• Jim Green commented that the milestone dates for Tasks 5.30 and 5.32 have not been updated.

Ms. Bunnewith responded that Task 5.32 has been completed, and Task 5.30 is a tool that is out for review. Ms. Bunnewith will update the milestone dates.

• Larry Solomon wanted to know the status of his letter submitted last year to FDOT asking for an elevated bridge on New Kings Road and Ribault River due to elevated stormwater levels. Mr. Soloman wanted to know what could be done to get this elevated bridge.

Mr. Sheffield responded that this sounds like a safety issue. The FDOT would typically do a conditions analysis and any action would be based on the physical condition of the bridge, deterioration, etc. Mr. Sheffield will provide this information to the FDOT.

- Larry Solomon commented that he submitted a request to the City to use CIP funds to install a bulkhead along the river's edge in the area of New Kings Road and Ribault River.
- Thomas Martin wanted to know if the area that Mr. Solomon is referring to is a federal waterway. Mr. Martin also wanted to know if there is anything obstructing the water flow.

Mr. Solomon responded that the Ribault River needs to be dredged as it has a considerable amount of muck.

Mr. Sheffield commented that we could get an assessment from FDOT on where that bridge ranks from a conditions review. This would be a good starting point.

Mr. Solomon asked that Mr. Sheffield request this information from FDOT.

Mr. Sheffield responded that he would contact FDOT on his behalf.

Thomas Martin moved to approve staff's request to amend the Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) for FY 2020/21 through FY 2021/22 (Addition of Second Year Projects); Eugene Yerkes seconded; motion unanimously carried.

D. <u>STAFF PRESENTATION ON THE DRAFT FY 2021/22 THROUGH FY 2025/26</u> TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP)

Elizabeth DeJesus presented the draft FY 2021/22 through FY 2025/26 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). Approval will be requested at the June meeting.

Ms. DeJesus asked for questions.

• Thomas Martin wanted to know if the Southside Boulevard Intersection Improvements project is included in the TIP.

Mr. Sheffield responded that this is just an overview of the projects. Mr. Sheffield said that staff would get clarification and report back to Mr. Martin.

• Thomas Martin commented that Argyle Forest Boulevard to Wells Road is a very controversial project. To date, there has not been any information shared with the public.

Mr. Sheffield responded that one of the first steps would be for FDOT to hold a public meeting to share the details of the project.

Chat Question - Are any of the Duval County projects requests from local government?

Mr. Sheffield responded that there are a number of projects in the Five Year Work Program requested from the counties. The LOPP that was adopted in February contains projects submitted by all four counties that then could be included in the work program.

• Lisa McGlynn wanted to know if SR 207 will be widened to six lanes. Currently, there is an incredible amount of construction in this area and it will only increase within the next few years. Ms. McGlynn wanted to know why this road would be resurfaced if it will be widened to six lanes.

Mr. Sheffield responded that the current pavement condition on this road most likely warrants resurfacing now, and the widening is not imminent.

Mr. Sheffield asked Autumn Martinage to get more information and report back to Ms. McGlynn.

- Autumn Martinage informed the group that SR 207 is scheduled for construction in FY 2022/23.
- Lisa McGlynn commented that to resurface SR 207 and then tear it up to widen it to six lanes is a waste of taxpayer dollars.
- Michael Wallwork commented that a roundabout would solve the problem on SR 207.
- Mr. Sheffield commented that each county's list of priority projects submitted to the TPO is most likely being led by their planning department and approved by their City Council or County Commission.
- Chairman Norton congratulated Wanda Forrest on her retirement and thanked her for her years of service.

E. <u>SMART NORTH FLORIDA UPDATE</u>

Clayton Levins, SNF Executive Director, introduced himself to the group.

• Jeff Sheffield informed the group the State of Florida and FDOT selected St. Augustine as one of their three statewide submittals for a grant proposal. This is a fully comprehensive Smart City initiative. • Archer First Response flies defibrillators with drones. The TPO hosted them along with Clay County Fire and Rescue so they could pitch their product for a potential beta test.

F. OLD BUSINESS

1. February 3, 2021 CAC Meeting – Response Needed from Staff/FDOT

• Jim Green wanted to know if the safety project at the interchange of I-295 and Monument Road will be added back into the Work Program.

Ms. Martinage will follow up with Jim Knight and provide a response.

May 7, 2021 – David Tyler, FDOT Project Manager, informed Mr. Green that the project number has been changed to 435950-1. This area, including 4456431-1, is being studied and is tentatively scheduled for construction in 2032.

2. April 7, 2021 CAC Meeting – Response Needed from Staff/FDOT

 Pat Keogh asked to see the study and guidelines that the City provided for the 8th Street Study.

Denise Bunnewith emailed the study and guidelines to Mr. Keogh April 7.

• Jim Green wanted to know if there is a capacity project in the area of I-95 and the Forest Street bridge heading north through Brooklyn or LaVilla.

Ms. Martinage will get back to Mr. Green with a response.

- Staff is currently reviewing the proposals received for the General Planning Consultant and Marketing Communications Consultant. A short-list will be brought before the Board next month for approval to begin contract negotiations. Staff anticipates having a fully executed contract for both these services by August.
- The TPO has received approval from the TD Commission to transition the TD Board responsibilities to the Northeast Florida Regional Council by July.
- Austin Chapman thanked Autumn Martinage for providing him with FDOT's Managed Lanes policy. The policy states that managed lanes will be considered on a case-by-case basis. Mr. Chapman commented that he thinks the TPO should be included in the decision making process as it affects the revenue generation for the region and operations on significant state facilities. Mr.

Chapman would like to know if there is a way that he could comment or share in the decision making process.

Mr. Sheffield responded that the LRTP is done once every five years, which is the time and place for these conversations. Per FDOT policy, there are no managed lanes in the current LRTP. If the FDOT's decision changes, it will require an amendment to the LRTP. Any amendment would affect the budgets of many of the projects within the plan.

 Denise Bunnewith commented that the cost per mile for managed lanes is significantly higher than general purpose lanes. The LRTP is fiscally constrained. To switch from general purpose lanes to managed lanes would result in the loss of projects.

Mr. Sheffield commented that as an example, approximately half of the I-95 widening from International Golf Parkway to downtown Jacksonville could have been done with managed lanes vs. the entire limits of the project being done with general purpose lanes.

 Austin Chapman commented that if we did more managed lanes we could do more projects. If we could generate excess revenue by doing managed lanes, I suggest we do it. Mr. Chapman would like a formal TPO review where comments could be provided.

Mr. Sheffield responded that staff can request a presentation on managed lanes from the FDOT.

- Lisa McGlynn commented that we need a solution other than building more roads. Ms. McGlynn suggested that the group could have a policy discussion on this issue.
- Tyrona Clark-Murray wanted to know if county governments can make alternations to state roads without their consideration.

Mr. Sheffield responded that county goverments cannot make alterations to state roads without their consideration. Anything happening on a state road requires input from the FDOT.

G. <u>NEW BUSINESS</u>

1. May 5, 2021 CAC Meeting – Response Needed from Staff/FDOT

• Several months ago, Mr. Solomon sent a letter to FDOT asking for an elevated bridge on New Kings Road over the Ribault River. The Ribault River needs to be dredged, as it has a considerable amount of muck. Mr. Solomon asked that Mr. Sheffield request this information from FDOT on his behalf.

Mr. Sheffield responded that staff will reach out to FDOT to get an assessment on where the bridge ranks from a conditions review standpoint.

• Thomas Martin wanted to know if the Southside Boulevard Intersection Improvements project is in the FY 2021/22 through FY 2025/26 Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP).

Mr. Sheffield responded that staff will get clarification and report back to *Mr.* Martin.

• It was requested that a copy of the TIP presentation be emailed to the group.

Mr. Sheffield emailed the presentation to the CAC members May 20.

• Lisa McGlynn wanted to know if SR 207 will be widened to six lanes. Currently, there is an incredible amount of construction in the area that will only increase over the next few years. Ms. McGlynn wanted to know why would the road would be resurfaced if it will be widened to six lanes.

Mr. Sheffield asked Autumn Martinage to get the project specifics and report back to Ms. McGlynn.

• Austin Chapman requested a formal TPO review of managed lanes where comments could be provided.

Mr. Sheffield responded that staff could contact FDOT to present on managed lanes and FDOT's policy.
