Chairman Companion welcomed everyone and called the Technical Advisory Committee meeting to order at 10 a.m. Introductions were made around the room.

A. <u>APPROVE THE AUGUST 7, 2024 MEETING MINUTES</u>

Chairman Companion asked that the August Technical Advisory Committee meeting minutes be approved.

Brett James moved to approve the August 7, 2024 meeting minutes; Dave McKee seconded; motion unanimously carried.

B. <u>APPROVE THE SEPTEMBER 4, 2024 MEETING MINUTES</u>

Chairman Companion asked that the September Technical Advisory Committee meeting minutes be approved.

• Xavier Pellicer commented the minutes state "Clark Letter responded SR 312 was not included in the TPO's LOPP based on its ranking in St. Johns County's list of priorities submitted to the TPO". Mr. Pellicer asked that the minutes reflect SR 312 is now in the plan.

Mr. Sheffield responded the minutes reflect the time and it is appropriate to leave it as stated. This gives us the ability in future minutes to reflect the correction was made.

Brett James moved to approve the September 4, 2024 meeting minutes; Xavier Pellicer seconded; motion unanimously carried.

Brett James moved to approve the FDOT's request to amend the FY 2024/25 through FY 2028/29 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP); Justin Ryan seconded; motion unanimously carried.

D. <u>RESOLUTION ADOPTING PERFORMANCE TARGETS FOR TRANSIT</u> SAFETY FOR SUNSHINE BUS COMPANY

Clark Letter informed the group FTA has established requirements through 49 CFR 673 for Public Transportation Agency Safety Plans (PTASP) and related performance measures as authorized by the Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act (MAP-21). The rule defines State of Good Repair (SGR) performance measures and establishes requirements for Transit Asset Management (TAM) Plans and performance targets.

Public transportation providers are required to update their TAM Plan every four years and state of good repair targets annually. MPOs are required to update TAM targets with every LRTP update.

Mr. Letter asked for questions. There were no questions at this time.

Mr. Letter asked for questions.

• Doug Conkey wanted to know what a cut-away bus is.

Mr. Norsworthy responded it is a smaller bus.

Brett James moved to approve Resolution 2024-9 adopting Performance Targets for Transit Asset Management for JTA; Jason Sparks seconded; motion unanimously carried.

H. <u>APPROVAL OF THE 2050 LONG RANGE TRANSPORTATION PLAN (LRTP)</u> COST FEASIBLE PLAN

Clark Letter thanked the group for their support in developing the TPO's 2050 LRTP. Staff is asking for approval of the Cost Feasible Plan that will guide the investment decisions of the TPO and its partners. The draft plan was presented at the September meeting for review and comment. The LRTP Steering Committee met September 25 to address additional comments and questions. The summary report and technical documents were updated and posted to the LRTP website for final comment.

Approval of the Cost Feasible Plan will complete adoption of the 2050 LRTP.

Wiley Page of Atkins Realis gave a final update on the LRTP.

Mr. Page asked for questions.

• Brett James commented he hopes there is a process to follow up and learn more about the community's interest in transit. Mr. James feels that until we have a transit system that is convenient and serves the needs of our community people will not utilize transit. He would like to know if there is anything surprising that came out of this exercise.

Mr. Page responded we have seen a significant increase in people favoring transit and bicycle/pedestrian safety. The community would also like to see investments in commuter rail and BRT. The biggest interest is in a train route from Jacksonville to St. Augustine. The citizens favor increasing taxes to implement transportation projects.

• Doug Conkey commented he feels accepting a tax increase at the local level is haphazard. Mr. Conkey wanted to know if the Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT) discussion is at the state or national level to replace gas taxes.

Mr. Sheffield responded this conversation is at the federal level. Oregon was a test site for what a VMT user fee would look like. All federal transportation funding comes through the gas tax, which is a dwindling funding source.

• Doug Conkey wanted to know if a weather event causes damage to an area in which a project is to take place and needs to be fixed immediately, does this allow you to go in and modify or add a project to take its place within the LRTP.

Mr. Sheffield responded any amendment to the LRTP triggers several federal processes and a potential re-evaluation of the costs of every project with the LRTP.

Doug Conkey moved to approve the 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan Cost Feasible Plan; Brett James seconded; motion unanimously approved.

I. <u>CITY OF JACKSONVILLE, VISION ZERO ACTION PLAN AND JTA</u> <u>CREATING SAFE SPACES ACTION PLAN</u> (JTA Presentation – Deferred)

Matt Fall of the City of Jacksonville presented their Vision Zero Action Plan.

Mr. Fall asked for questions.

• Doug Conkey asked how you classify electric powered scooters, bikes, etc.

Mr. Fall responded motorized and non-motorized are the two modes for classification.

 Jason Sparks wanted to know how COJ will enforce the speed limits on the bike trails.

Mr. Fall responded we have created a Joint Vision Zero Task Force with JTA. There are several enforcement representatives that can help us with our recommended policies and plans that serve on the task force.

• Brett James thanked Matt Fall for the work he does on behalf of the City. Mr. James wanted to know the connection between the projects he is working on, the

work he is doing and what needs to be done going forward. He also would like to know if there are some cost-effective solutions being made.

Mr. Fall responded we are working on a green and complete streets policy for projects prior to 90 percent design. Also, as mode share increases so do crashes.

• Brett James commented he lived in San Diego and on average 12 bicycle fatalities occurred per year. Mr. James would like to know the statistics for Jacksonville.

Mr. Fall responded bicycle deaths are 10-20 and pedestrian deaths are 45-50 each year.

• Brett James wanted to know if the Context Sensitive Solutions Committee work is locally or state funded.

Mr. Fall responded it takes a strong partnership with FDOT. The Green and Complete Streets Policy would be for local projects that we have.

• Chris LeDew commented he appreciates Mr. Fall's bicycle/pedestrian data collection. Mr. LeDew wanted to know what has been done in terms of the data collection and what is planned for the future.

Mr. Fall responded there has been a significant increase in bike/pedestrian traffic. FDOT has installed a permanent pedestrian counter along the "S" line and the Fuller Warren bike/pedestrian path.

J. SMART NORTH FLORIDA

Mr. Sheffield informed the group FDOT District 5, through a partnership with Waze, has all 35 sensors feeding into that system. Currently, it tells you there is a blockage with a ten-minute delay before it is triggered.

Subject: Adopting Safety Performance Targets for the North Florida TPO

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) published several rules establishing performance measures and reporting requirements for State Departments of Transportation (DOTs) and Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs). These rules establish measures to assess the condition of road safety witin MPO boundaries. The defined performance measures that must be tracked by MPOs are shown below:

Performance Measure	Description
Number of Fatalities	The total number of persons suffering fatal injuries in a motor vehicle crash during a calendar year.
Rate of Fatalities	The total number of fatalities per 100 million vehicle miles traveled (VMT) in a calendar year.
Number of Serious Injuries	The total number of persons suffering at least one serious injury in a motor vehicle crash during a calendar year.
Rate of Serious Injuries	The total number of serious injuries per 100 million VMT in a calendar year.
Number of Non-Motorized Fatalities and Non-Motorized Serious Injuries	The combined total number of non-motorized fatalities and non-motorized serious injuries involving a motor vehicle during a calendar year.

FDOT annually establishes statewide safety targets for the following calendar year as part of the HSIP Annual Report, which must be submitted by August 31 each year. Targets are applicable to all public roads regardless of functional classification or ownership.

MPOs have the option of supporting the statewide targets or establishing their own targets for the MPO planning area. MPOs must set their targets within 180 days after FDOT sets the statewide targets. MPOs must annually update their targets by February 27 of each year.

WHEREAS, the North Florida Transportation Planning Organization is also required to adopt annual performance targets for these measures;

Subject: Annual List of Priority Projects

Staff is soliciting projects for the annual List of Priority Projects (LOPP). This is a candidate list of projects for the new fifth year of the Florida Department of Transportation's Five Year Work Program. Please submit your initial priority projects no later than **January 24, 2025**. We understand that formal approval by your county commission or council may take longer, but this request will enable TPO staff to prepare a first draft of the LOPP for the February round of committee and Board meetings. Our expectation will be to adopt the LOPP in March.

The LOPP document includes the following categories of projects:

Region-Wide Priority Projects – Transportation Capacity Projects

This list is perhaps the most important. This list of 20 projects represents the larger capacity and high priority projects throughout the TPO area. This list does not change substantially from year to year, as projects are typically only removed from the list when construction funding has been programmed.

• Aviation Priority Projects

Jacksonville Aviation Authority and St. Augustine - St. Johns County Airport Authority can each submit a list of its priorities for inclusion in the document. The TPO includes these as a reference, but does not re-prioritize these projects.

• Mass Transit Priorities

Jacksonville Transportation Authority and St. Johns/Sunshine Bus can each submit a list of its priorities for inclusion in the document. The TPO includes these as a reference, but does not re-prioritize these projects.

• Port Priority Projects

JAXPORT and the Ocean Highway & Port Authority of Nassau County can each submit a list of its priorities for inclusion in the document. The TPO includes these as a reference, but does not re-prioritize these projects. • Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) – Multi-Use Trails or Sidewalks

TAP projects are funded on a rotational basis by County. Our estimated total TAP funding of \$3M will be split to fund two different Counties at approximately \$1.5M each. We are asking that each county please submit two TAP projects to provide a backup in case any issues arise with the first project submission.

• SUN Trail Program – Multi-Use Trails

It is especially critical that each county submit one viable project for each of the TAP and SUN Trail Programs. <u>Cost estimates must be provided</u>. It is recommended you revisit the project submitted annually to ensure it is still feasible. Applications must be submitted through the GAP system. Please submit the entire trail to our list broken into fundable segments, and indicate the priority of each segment.

• Transportation Regional Incentive Program Priorities

Transportation Regional Incentives Program (TRIP) priorities reflect the region-wide priority list.

Again, please submit your initial priority projects no later than January 24, 2025.
