CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Rutkowski welcomed everyone and called the Technical Advisory Committee meeting to order at 10:02 a.m. Introductions were made around the room.

PUBLIC COMMENT

None at this time.

► A. APPROVE THE DECEMBER 7, 2022 MEETING MINUTES

Chairman Rutkowski asked that the December Technical Advisory Committee meeting minutes be approved.

Bill Killingsworth moved to approve the December 7, 2022 meeting minutes; Steve Smith seconded; motion unanimously carried.

▶B. ELECTING OFFICERS

Chairman Rutkowski opened the floor for nominations for Chairman. Reuben Franklin nominated Bill Killingsworth, who accepted the nomination. The Chair asked for any other nominations. Seeing none, Chairman Rutkowski moved to close the nominations for Chairman; seconded by Holly Coyle; motion unanimously carried. Bill Killingsworth will be the 2023 TAC Chairman.

Chairman Rutkowski opened the floor for nominations for Vice Chairman. Steve Smith nominated Robert Companion, who accepted the nomination. The Chair asked for any other nominations. Seeing none, Chairman Rutkowski moved to close the nominations for Vice Chairman; seconded by Sean Rush; motion unanimously carried. Robert Companion will be the 2023 TAC Vice Chairman.

►C. FDOT REQUESTS AMENDING THE FY 2022/23 THROUGH FY 2026/27 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP)

Bill Killingsworth moved to approve the FDOT's request to amend the FY 2022/23 through FY 2026/27 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP); Reuben Franklin seconded; motion unanimously carried.

▶D. RESOLUTION ADOPTING 2023 BRIDGE AND PAVEMENT TARGETS

Clark Letter informed the group that 23 CFR 490 requires the FDOT to adopt targets for bridge and pavement conditions. The North Florida TPO is also required to adopt performance targets for these measures and would like to adopt the FDOT's performance targets for bridge and pavement conditions.

Mr. Letter asked for questions. There were no questions at this time.

Bill Killingsworth moved to approve Resolution 2023-1 adopting the 2023 Bridge and Pavement Targets; Dodie Selig seconded; motion unanimously carried.

►E. RESOLUTION ADOPTING 2023 SYSTEM PERFORMANCE TARGETS

Clark Letter informed the group that 23 CFR 490 requires the FDOT to adopt targets for system performance for the National Highway System, Freight and Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ). The North Florida TPO is also required to adopt

performance targets for these measures and would like to adopt the FDOT's system performance targets.

Mr. Letter asked for questions.

 Bill Killingsworth asked for an explanation of the Truck Travel Time Reliability Index.

Mr. Letter responded the Truck Travel Time Reliability Index is where you have travel times on a roadway distributed on varying days and times. Over the course of a year, take the 50th percentile travel time and the 95th percentile travel time and divide the 95th percentile by the 50th percentile and that gives you the index. In this case, if your index goes above 1.75 that would be a failing condition and for the four-year target anything over two is a failing condition.

Bill Killingsworth moved to approve Resolution 2023-2 adopting the 2023 System Performance Targets; Reuben Franklin seconded; motion unanimously carried.

F. DRAFT 2023 LIST OF PRIORITY PROJECTS (LOPP)

Clark Letter presented the draft 2023 List of Priority Projects (LOPP). Approval will be requested at the March meeting.

Mr. Letter asked for questions.

- Mr. Sheffield commented the unranked projects are fully funded. They are on the list so they stay on the DOT's radar.
- Kelsey Cox asked who provides the estimates for the projects.
 - Mr. Sheffield responded that it depends on the nature of the project.
- Kelsey Cox asked who would provide the estimate for the UNF Drive/Alumni Drive project.
 - Mr. Sheffield responded the applicant is responsible for the estimate.

G. <u>DRAFT REQUESTED STUDIES FOR FY 2022/23 – FY 2023/24 UNIIFIED PLANNING WORK PROGRAM (UPWP)</u>

Clark Letter presented the draft requested studies for the FY 2022/23 - FY 2023/24 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP). Approval will be requested at the May meeting.

Mr. Letter asked for questions. There were no questions at this time.

H. <u>SMART NORTH FLORIDA UPDATE</u>

Clayton Levins gave the following update.

 Working with Representative Wyman Duggan on an appropriations project request for SNF to actively use a certain threshold of state dollars for potential technology deployments with municipal county and agency partners. We are looking to accelerate the adoption of technology at the local and county level.

- Reuben Franklin asked the last time a regional Bicycle Safety campaign was done.

Mr. Sheffield responded it has been a while since a regional campaign was done. The stakeholder group for the update to the regional safety plan will meet immediately following this meeting. We intend to create targeted areas for the safety campaigns, and assign funding to begin next year.

OVERVIEW

The North Florida Transportation Planning Organization (North Florida TPO) Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for Fiscal Years 2024/2025 through 2028/2029 begins with preparing a "List of Priority Projects" to be used in developing the Florida Department of Transportation's (FDOT) Tentative Five Year Work Program. The "List of Priority Projects" identifies potential projects to be funded in the new fifth year (2028/2029) of the FDOT Work Program. However, by creating the Strategic Intermodal System (SIS) and the Transportation Regional Incentive Program (TRIP) in Florida, the "List of Priority Projects" now includes potential projects to be funded in other years of the FDOT Work Program under the SIS and TRIP programs. The "List of Priority Projects" includes a prioritized listing of state highway, mass transit, aviation, intermodal, and Transportation Alternative Program (TAP) and Transportation Regional Incentive Program (TRIP) projects*.

The North Florida TPO expects all projects currently programmed in the FDOT Work Program to advance to the next development phase. This will ensure that implementing the 3-C planning process (continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive) in the North Florida TPO area is being implemented, as required by federal and state statutes. If FDOT cannot complete the programmed phase and advance the project to the next logical phase, it is incumbent that the agency provides an explanation to the North Florida TPO.

PROJECT PHASING

- Project Development and Environment (PD&E)
- Preliminary Engineering (PE)
- Right-of-Way (ROW)
- Construction (CST)

Intended adoption is at the March TPO Board Meeting, following review by the TAC and CAC.

2045 LONG RANGE TRANSPORTATION PLAN

On November 14, 2019 the North Florida TPO adopted Path Forward 2045, a fiscally constrained Long Range Transportation Plan for Clay, Duval, Nassau and St. Johns Counties. Concurrent with this effort the following documents were prepared:

Resilience and Vulnerability

- The North TPO examined the vulnerability of major roads in the region. Vulnerability is ranked from low to high. The vulnerability rating of relevant facilities is indicated on the List of Region-Wide Priority Projects.  - TPO Staff works with local governments to develop a preliminary List of Priority Projects to submit to the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC), Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC) and Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) Board for review and approval at the March TAC, CAC and TPO Board Meetings.
 - Mass transit and aviation projects are prioritized by the submitting agencies and are forwarded to the North Florida TPO to include in the LOPP Document.
 - Adopting the List of Priority Projects (March)
 - Following approval by the North Florida TPO, the List of Priority Projects is submitted to FDOT for use in developing the Five-Year Tentative Work Program.


