CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Walter Kloss called the meeting to order at 2:03 p.m. and Doug Conkey led the Pledge of Allegiance.

PUBLIC COMMENT

None.

A. APPROVE THE JULY 2, 2025 MEETING MINUTES

Chairman Walter Kloss asked for approval of the minutes of the July Citizens Advisory Committee meeting.

Charles Pappas moved to approve the July 2, 2025 minutes; Branch Davis seconded; motion unanimously carried.

B. <u>FDOT REQUESTS AMENDING THE TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP) FOR FY 2025/26 – FY 2029/30 TO INCLUDE PROJECTS IN THE ROLL FORWARD REPORT</u>

Anna Siju informed the group the Roll Forward Report includes projects or phases of projects that were approved in the FY 2024/25 – FY 2028/29 TIP but were authorized or begun prior to July 1, 2025. These projects then "Roll Forward" into the first year of the new FY 2025/26 – FY 2029/30 TIP.

Ms. Siju asked for questions. There were no questions at this time.

Branch Davis moved to approve the FDOT's request to amend the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for FY 2025/26 – FY 2029/30 to include projects in the Roll Forward Report; Bernie O'Connor seconded; motion unanimously carried.

C. <u>AMENDMENT OF THE METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION</u> AGREEMENT

Clark Letter presented the amendment of the Metropolitan Planning Organization Agreement to include PL funds in the amount of \$80,867.

Mr. Letter asked for questions.

 Chairman Kloss asked with this amendment what is the total dollar amount for the project.

Mr. Letter responded the total budgetary ceiling for the project is \$7,473,219. The budget, including tasks, is detailed in the UPWP, "Exhibit A".

Branch Davis moved to approve the amendment of the Metropolitan Planning Organization Agreement; Bernie O'Connor seconded; motion unanimously carried.

D. <u>AMENDMENT OF THE UNIFIED PLANNING WORK PROGRAM (UPWP) FOR</u> FY 2024/25 – FY 2025/26

Clark Letter presented the amendment of the Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) for FY 2024/25 – FY 2025/26.

The UPWP is the task-based budget of the North Florida TPO. It includes administrative tasks, a number of required work tasks such as the TIP, Congestion Management Process, LRTP and other related planning tasks including transit planning, most of which is performed by JTA.

Additional PL funds in the amount of \$80,867 became available and are proposed to be added to "Task 1.5 – General Consultant Services" in year two of the UPWP. To clearly indicate available funds for expenditure in year two, funds that were not expended in year one of the UPWP are proposed to be moved into year two of the UPWP. This includes CM, PL and SU dollars in the amount of \$64,124.59, \$157,130.50 and \$163,375 respectively for a total of \$384,630.09.

Mr. Letter asked for questions. There were no questions at this time.

Branch Davis moved to approve the amendment of the Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) for FY 2024/25 – FY 2025/26; Scott Cowitt seconded; motion unanimously carried.

E. <u>INNOVATIVE TRUCK PARKING AVAILABILITY SYSTEM (iTPAS) STUDY</u>

Dr. Thobias Sando of UNF presented a brief overview of the study that examined the iTPAS truck parking management system. The study establishes best practices employing camera detection systems in managing truck parking.

Dr. Sando asked for questions.

• Bernie O'Connor commented this should be implemented into the regular maintenance of the cameras and the equipment.

Dr. Sando responded the TPO has funded this study to look at accuracy issues and in Phase 2 FDOT will make improvements based on the findings. An additional study will be done to compare the two.

- Chip Dobson asked if there are any places that just monitor the number of vehicles coming in and out and give the number of available spaces.
 - Mr. Sheffield responded for example in the St. Augustine parking garage the technology provides that exact data.
 - Dr. Sando commented this same algorithm can be slightly modified and used to monitor parking conditions for planning purposes.
- Chairman Kloss asked if the truck drivers rely on the information provided relative to parking in an individual rest area.
 - Mr. Sheffield responded usage by truck drivers, etc. depends on the reliability and accuracy of the information displayed.

F. SMART NORTH FLORIDA

SNF has a pilot underway with each of the following companies.

- Urban Hawk Using computer vision to understand pavement and asset conditions in Green Cove Springs.
- Spot Genius Using computer vision to understand real time parking conditions in St. Augustine for their surface lots and curb parking.
- Geolava Using AI agents and satellite imagery for disaster recovery. This is a result of a problem statement given to us by FDOT District 2.

Mr. Levins asked for questions.

• Doug Conkey asked if the Geolava technology could be used to monitor the erosion of the sand dunes in our area.

Mr. Levins responded it could be used to do that.

JULY 2, 2025 CAC Meeting – Response Needed from Staff/FDOT

 Jim Green commented that the resurfacing project from I-295 (SR 9A) from Monument Road to St. Johns Bluff Road is in the middle of a longer segment reflected in the LRTP. Mr. Green would like to know if the work is being coordinated for these two projects so the resurfacing work would not have to be redone. Relative to the coordination, will it affect the bridge replacement within this segment?

FDOT responded the coordination will occur to try to avoid any rework. Additionally, #446047-2 (I-95 over Saints Road) does not overlap with the resurfacing project (#209658-7).

 Marci Larson introduced Ken Charron as a prospective CAC member. Mr. Charron served on the CAC 20 years ago.

I. CAC COMMENT

• Joe Trottie asked if the schedule for cleanup along the roadways has been reduced. Mr. Trottie was going southbound across the Fuller Warren bridge and saw it was littered with debris and an old tire.

Mr. Sheffield responded he does not know if the schedules have been reduced. For example, an FDOT vendor has five roads for which they are responsible to keep free of debris and are graded on a scale from A to F on their job performance. If they get an A on two of those roadways, it averages out to a passing grade.

• Bernie O'Connor commented he believes there is a problem in our area with pedestrian deaths.

Mr. Sheffield responded the Duval County School Board has developed a task force to address this issue.

Thalia Fuste informed the group the TPO is kicking off the "Best Foot Forward" program in Duval and St. Johns County this fall. The program aims to address a lack of driver compliance and a failure to yield to pedestrians at crossings. Partners from *Bike/Walk Central Florida* will work with the TPO and community stakeholders to collect data at low compliance crossings, utilize high visibility enforcement, suggest low-cost engineering upgrades, and provide education on key traffic laws.

Adopting Safety Performance Targets for the North Florida TPO

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) published several rules establishing performance measures and reporting requirements for State Departments of Transportation (DOTs) and Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs). These rules establish measures to assess the condition of road safety within MPO boundaries. The defined performance measures that must be tracked by MPOs are shown below:

Performance Measure	Description
Number of Fatalities	The total number of persons suffering fatal injuries in
	a motor vehicle crash during a calendar year.
Rate of Fatalities	The total number of fatalities per 100 million vehicle
	miles traveled (VMT) in a calendar year.
Number of Serious Injuries	The total number of persons suffering at least one
	serious injury in a motor vehicle crash during a
	calendar year.
Rate of Serious Injuries	The total number of serious injuries per 100 million
	VMT in a calendar year.
Number of Non-Motorized	The combined total number of non-motorized
Fatalities and Non-Motorized	fatalities and non-motorized serious injuries involving
Serious Injuries	a motor vehicle during a calendar year.

FDOT annually establishes statewide safety targets for the following calendar year as part of the HSIP Annual Report, which must be submitted by August 31 each year. Targets are applicable to all public roads regardless of functional classification or ownership.

MPOs have the option of supporting the statewide targets or establishing their own targets for the MPO planning area. MPOs must set their targets within 180 days after FDOT sets the statewide targets. MPOs must annually update their targets by February 27 of each year.



RESOLUTION 2025-9 ADOPTING SAFETY PERFORMANCE TARGETS

WHEREAS, as required by 23 CFR 490, for Calendar Year 2026 the Florida Department of Transportation has adopted aspirational targets for number of *fatalities*, *number of serious injuries*, *fatality rate*, *serious injury rate*, *total number of non-motorized fatalities* and *serious injuries*; and

WHEREAS, the North Florida Transportation Planning Organization is also required to adopt annual performance targets for these measures;
