#### **CALL TO ORDER**

Chairman Mario Dipola called the meeting to order at 2:02 p.m. and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### **PUBLIC COMMENT**

None.

#### A. <u>APPROVE THE OCTOBER 2, 2024 MEETING MINUTES</u>

Chairman Mario Dipola asked for approval of the minutes of the October Citizens Advisory Committee meeting.

Branch Davis moved to approve the October 2, 2024 minutes as amended; Barney Roberts seconded; motion unanimously carried.

#### B. **ELECTING OFFICERS**

Chairman Dipola opened the floor for nominations for Chairman. Doug Conkey nominated Walter Kloss, who accepted the nomination. The Chair asked for any other nominations.

Branch Davis nominated Doug Conkey for Chairman. Mr. Conkey declined the nomination and endorsed Walter Kloss as Chairman. The Chair asked for any other nominations.

Seeing none, Chairman Dipola moved to close the nominations for Chairman; seconded by Bernie O'Connor; motion unanimously carried. Walter Kloss will be the 2025 CAC Chairman.

Chairman Dipola opened the floor for nominations for Vice Chairman. Jim Hill nominated Jim Green, who accepted the nomination. The Chair asked for any other nominations.

Seeing none, Chairman Dipola moved to close the nominations for Vice Chairman; seconded by Barney Roberts; motion unanimously carried. Jim Green will be the 2025 CAC Vice Chairman.

#### C. RESOLUTION ADOPTING 2025 SAFETY PERFORMANCE TARGETS

Clark Letter informed the group the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) published several rules establishing performance measures and reporting requirements for State

Departments of Transportation (DOTs) and Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs). These rules establish measures to assess the condition of road safety within MPO boundaries. FDOT annually establishes statewide safety targets applicable to all public roads regardless of functional classification or ownership. MPOs have the option of supporting the statewide targets or establishing their own for the MPO planning area. The TPO supports FDOT's statewide targets.

#### Mr. Letter asked for questions.

Chairman Dipola commented relative to dangerous by design being in the top ten
we were one of two municipalities to have a raw decrease in fatalities and
serious injuries for peds.

Mr. Letter responded we are out of the top ten.

Branch Davis wanted to know if population growth is factored into these targets.

Mr. Letter responded we look at the number of fatalities, serious injuries, and the rate that considers number of vehicles on the roadway.

 Austin Chapman thanked Mr. Letter for showing the chart with the previous year's data related to these targets. Mr. Chapman wanted to know if there is anything specific you can highlight on what is being done to improve these results.

Mr. Letter responded last year the TPO finished our Strategic Safety Plan that identifies roadways with many different issues and recommendations for countermeasures to improve those conditions. Those recommendations are given to FDOT to help assist them in their decision-making process for safety projects.

Ms. Larson commented the TPO has done safety campaigns in the past, as well as Safe Street Summits. We have a Safe Street Summit January 23 at UNF beginning at 11:30 a.m.

- Bernie O'Connor commented we need to continue working towards the target of zero. Mr. O'Connor appreciates the efforts being made to meet this target.
- Walter Kloss wanted to know if this applies to all roads or only state roads.

Mr. Letter responded this applies to all roads.

 Walter Kloss commented since 2016 there has been a decline in the number of non-motorized fatalities and serious injuries. Mr. Kloss wanted to know what triggered the decline. Mr. Letter responded it is difficult to capture on an aggregate level when you are looking at the entire TPO boundary. FDOT has started tracking on a project-by-project basis those specific corridors and how the safety incidents tracked over several years. When you implement a counter measure you really need five years of data to evaluate the impact.

 Walter Kloss commented he would like to see the numbers for day and night occurrences of pedestrian fatalities.

Mr. Letter responded as part of our Annual Mobility Report we will dive deeper into the numbers to see what is going on.

- John Stack commented the crashes are becoming more serious because of speed, etc. resulting in deaths as opposed to being recorded as serious injuries.
   Mr. Stack feels the decline may not be as positive as it seems.
- Angel Corrales asked if this data includes the year and make of the vehicles.

Mr. Letter responded the crash reports contain a wealth of information and should include the year and make of the vehicle. He will look into it and report back.

- Doug Conkey commented it is impossible to be at zero. A ten percent drop each
  year would get things on the right trajectory. We can bring this number down
  with training, methodologies, procedures, traffic calming, etc. Mr. Conkey would
  like to know how we get funding to implement these solutions.
- Jim Green informed the group FDOT is holding a public hearing today in Atlantic Beach regarding a segment of Mayport Road that will take it from six lanes to four lanes and adding bicycle/pedestrian facilities. Mr. Green is curious to see how the public responds.
- Chairman Dipola would like to see a presentation on the Safety Strategic Plan at a future CAC meeting.

Bernie O'Connor moved to adopt the 2025 Safety Performance Targets; Branch Davis seconded; motion unanimously carried.

## D. <u>FDOT REQUESTS AMENDING THE FY 20254/25 - FY 2028/29 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP)</u>

Victoria Kutney presented the following amendment to the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for FY 2024/25 – FY 2028/29.

A copy of the request is included in Section D, which includes the following projects:

- 441220-3 Race Track Road at SR 5 (US1)
   Intersection Improvement/FDOT/St. Johns County
- 445431-2 SR 211 (St. Johns/Riverside Ave.) from San Juan Ave. to I-95 (SR 9) Drainage Improvements/FDOT/Duval County

Ms. Kutney asked for questions.

- Austin Chapman commented Wells Creek north of Race Track Road is a traffic challenge. Mr. Chapman suggested FDOT take a look at Wells Creek.
- Jim Green wanted to know if there are projected construction years for either of the projects.
  - Ms. Kutney responded she does not know at this time.
- Angel Corrales asked if the San Juan Avenue project will extend to the Fairfax neighborhood.
  - Ms. Kutney responded she does not know at this time.
- Bernie O'Connor commented the City has a plan to do a sidewalk/trail
  improvement along Beach Boulevard. The drainage improvement took away the
  sidewalk and built a temporary sidewalk at the edge of the right-of-way. It would
  have been nice to build the trail improvement instead of putting the sidewalk way
  back from the road. Coordination between the various entities would be great.

Mr. Sheffield responded coordination meetings between the various entities take place but are not consistent.

Barney Roberts moved to approve the FDOT's request to amend the FY 2024/25 – FY 2028/29 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP); Bernie O'Connor seconded; motion unanimously carried.

### E. <u>LIST OF PRIORITY PROJECTS (LOPP)</u>

Clark Letter informed the group staff is soliciting projects for the annual List of Priority Projects (LOPP). This is a candidate list of projects for the new fifth year of the Florida Department of Transportation's Five Year Work Program. Please submit your initial priority projects no later than **January 24**, **2025**. We understand that formal approval by your county commission or council may take longer, but this request will enable TPO staff to prepare a first draft of the LOPP for the February 6 committee and Board meetings. Our expectation will be to adopt the LOPP in March.

Mr. Letter asked for questions. There were no questions at this time.

## F. <u>UNIFIED PLANNING WORK PROGRAM (UPWP) FY 2025/26 SPECIAL STUDIES</u>

Clark Letter informed the group the Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) is the North Florida Transportation Planning Organization's (TPO's) two-year tasked based budget. Bi-annually, TPO staff updates the UPWP as required by state and federal regulations. The UPWP outlines all major transportation planning activities undertaken by the TPO for the two-year planning period beginning July 1, 2024 and ending June 30, 2026.

The North Florida TPO is requesting studies to consider for FY 2025/26. These projects will be located in **Section 5 – Special Projects** section of the UPWP and are executed by a TPO General Consultant.

Mr. Letter asked for questions.

- Chairman Dipola wanted to know the number of studies done each year.
  - Mr. Letter responded it depends on the complexity of the study. It is usually around ten studies a year.
- Chairman Dipola wanted to know what happens to the studies once they are done. Are they given to FDOT or do they result in a project being done?
  - Mr. Sheffield responded it is on a case-by-case basis and depends on the purpose of a study. Any time you see a study that you would like more information on do not hesitate to ask and we can do a presentation to the CAC.

#### G. FDOT ANNUAL WORK PROGRAM PRESENTATION

Victoria Kutney gave a brief presentation on FDOT's Annual Work Program.

Ms. Kutney asked for questions.

- Chairman Dipola wanted to know the website to view the Work Program presentation.
  - Ms. Kutney responded she will provide that information via TPO staff.
- Austin Chapman wanted to know on page #17 of the PowerPoint presentation it shows a few sections of I-95 as resurfacing. Do those go away with the widening of I-95 in the same place in the same year? Mr. Chapman also had the same questions relative to SR-16.
  - Ms. Kutney responded she does not have that information at this time.

 Austin Chapman wanted to know if the University Complete Streets project is near Jacksonville University.

Ms. Kutney responded if Mr. Chapman emails her his question she will look into it

 Pat Keogh wanted to know the percentage of costs associated with the projects in the Work Program paid for with federal funds.

Ms. Kutney does not have that information at this time.

Mr. Sheffield responded Florida is one of the least dependent states relative to federal funding. We are probably 75% to 80% funded with state funding.

- Bernie O'Connor commented the interstate projects are 90% federal funded.
- Pat Keogh wanted to know the quality of the commitment from the various funding sources.

Mr. Sheffield responded anything within the transportation space is a five to seven year infrastructure bill at the federal level. Those formulas and buckets of funding are set on an annual basis with little changes over the five years.

John Stack wanted to know what railroad utilities include.

Mr. Sheffield responded it is infrastructure related to the crossing and not the railway.

• Bernie O'Connor commented it is a phase of the project that is lumped into railroad utilities.

- Mr. Sheffield responded we received a public comment and it will be included in the final documentation. The TPO has a 90-day window to finalize all documentation to meet federal requirements.

- Jim Green wanted to know if this second ferry will improve service.

Mr. Norsworthy responded the second ferry will probably become the main ferry and will improve service.

Branch Davis moved to approve the JTA's request to amend the FY 2024/25 – FY 2028/29 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for the Race Track Road at SR 5 Intersection Improvement project; Barney Roberts seconded; motion unanimously carried.

Branch Davis moved to approve the JTA's request to amend the FY 2024/25 – FY 2028/29 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for the Passenger Ferry grant program project; Bernie O'Connor seconded; motion unanimously carried.


