CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Stack called the meeting to order at 2:01 p.m. and Branch Davis led the Pledge of Allegiance.

PUBLIC COMMENT

None.

► A. APPROVE THE JUNE 1, 2022 MEETING MINUTES

Chairman Stack asked for approval of the minutes of the June Citizens Advisory Committee meeting.

Branch Davis moved to approve the June 1, 2022 minutes; Barney Roberts seconded; motion unanimously carried.

- Chairman Stack asked Mr. Sheffield if the TAC had any questions or concerns regarding today's action items.
 - Mr. Sheffield responded that the TAC did not have any questions or concerns regarding the action items. All action items passed unanimously.

►B. <u>JTA REQUESTS AMENDING THE FY 2021/22 THROUGH FY 2025/26</u> TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP)

Richard Clark presented the amendment to the Transportation Improvement Program for FY 2021/22 through FY 2025/26.

• 424367-2 – JTA Renewable Energy Generation for Electric Vehicles

Mr. Clark asked for questions. There were no questions at this time.

Jim Robinson moved to approve the JTA's request to amend the FY 2021/22 through FY 2025/26 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP); Barney Roberts seconded; motion unanimously carried.

►C. FDOT REQUESTS AMENDING THE TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP) FOR FY 2022/23 THROUGH FY 2026/27 TO INCLUDE PROJECTS IN THE ROLL FORWARD REPORT

Jeff Sheffield presented the amendment to the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for FY 2022/23 through FY 2026/27.

The Roll Forward Amendment includes projects or phases of projects that were approved in the FY 2022/23 through FY 2026/27 TIP, but were authorized or begun prior to July 1, 2022. These projects then "Roll Forward" into the first year of the new FY 2022/23 through FY 2026/27 TIP.

Mr. Sheffield asked for questions. There were no questions at this time.

Barney Roberts moved to approve the FDOT's request to amend the FY 2022/23 through FY 2026/27 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to include projects in the Roll Forward Report; Bernie O'Connor seconded; motion unanimously carried.

D. <u>DRAFT PROJECT RECOMMENDATIONS FOR SU FUNDING FOR FY 2023/24</u> <u>THROUGH FY 2027/28</u>

Jeff Sheffield presented the draft project recommendations for SU funding for FY 2023/24 through FY 2027/28.

Mr. Sheffield asked for questions.

- Thomas Martin asked if there is any discussion to eliminate grade crossings and replace them with bridges.
 - Mr. Sheffield responded that is not an option.
- Lisa Marasco wanted to know, regarding the Southbank FEC Vehicle Reroute Study, if the five locations are in this area or within Duval County.
 - Mr. Sheffield responded that the TPO has secured funding to deploy sensors throughout the region for early train detection.
- Jim Hill asked if the five locations are represented on the map.
 - Mr. Sheffield responded that the five locations are represented on the map in blue.
- Lisa McGlynn asked what ACSU means.

Mr. Sheffield responded that SU is Surface Urbanized, which are funds that come directly to MPOs based on population. AC is advanced construction. These funds are used for surface transportation projects.

- Mario Dipola asked if the funds related to the Mayport Road project are for construction.
 - Mr. Sheffield said that these are construction funds.
- James Green asked if the Main Street project is in the construction phase.
 - Mr. Sheffield responded that this project is in the construction phase.
- Eugene Yerkes asked why the past five years are in the 20s and the forecast is around 15.
 - Mr. Sheffield responded that when the forecast years become the past years they end up like that. These are forecast without contingency funds and safe formula calculations. We will see more than what we are programming. These are representative of what is currently programmed within that year.
- Jim Robinson asked about the technology projects to be determined. Mr. Robinson wanted to know if the determination period will be prior to next month.
 - Mr. Sheffield responded that those will turn into projects next year.

E. <u>DRAFT PROJECT RECOMMENDATIONS FOR CMAQ FUNDING FOR FY</u> 2023/24 THROUGH FY 2027/28

Jeff Sheffield presented the draft project recommendations for CMAQ funding for FY 2023/24 through FY 2027/28.

Mr. Sheffield asked for questions.

- Michael Wallwork commented that the proposed roundabout for SR 228 is a creative design.
- Nichole Mobley asked what CMAQ stands for.

Mr. Sheffield responded that CMAQ is Congestion Mitigation Air Quality and are for projects related to improving congestion and air quality.

F. <u>CITY OF JACKSONVILLE ON-STREET BIKEWAYS AND SHARED-USE PATHS (TRAILS) WEBMAP TOOL PRESENTATION</u>

Matthew Fall, COJ's Bike-Ped Coordinator, gave a brief presentation on their bike facilities inventory tool.

Mr. Fall asked for questions. There were no questions at this time.

G. SMART NORTH FLORIDA UPDATE

Clayton Levins gave the following update.

- A representative from StormSensor will brief the TPO Board in October on the Neptune Beach project.
- A representative from TrainFo will present the findings from their pilot program with FDOT for the US 17 and San Juan Avenue area to the TPO Board in November.
- Beginning in September, SNF will hold quarterly stakeholder meetings with a possible virtual option.

H. OLD BUSINESS

I. NEW BUSINESS

 Chairman Stack commented that due to the Sunshine Laws it is very difficult to get together with CAC members from the same county. He suggested assigning subcommittees for each of the counties and they could meet at the beginning or end of the CAC meetings. Chairman Stack also asked if anyone had suggestions on how to communicate among the members at the county level.

J. PUBLIC COMMENT

- Tyrona Clark-Murray commented that she would like to hear more about the discussions Richard Clark had with the St. Johns County Commission regarding commuter rail.
 - Mr. Sheffield responded that we will reach out to Mr. Clark and have him come and present to the CAC. This was a very specific item for a new rezoning classification that would allow for multi-modal hubs, and rail became part of the conversation.
- Michael Wallwork commented that light rail can be built within an existing roadway without any new right-of-way required.

- Tyrona Clark-Murray asked if anyone has reached out to St. Augustine to give them Mr. Wallwork's perspective on light rail.
 - Mr. Sheffield responded that this is not a St. Augustine conversation. It became the JTA commuter rail conversation because it was tied to the rezoning conversation. St. Augustine is not leading a commuter rail initiative. This is if in the future commuter rail goes to St. Augustine.
- Charles Pappas commented that right-of-way is usually a problem, but in this
 case it is not an issue.
- Candice LeCompte wanted to know if commuter rail would allow for bicycles.
 - Mr. Sheffield responded that he is sure that would be an option, but he is not certain.
- Thomas Martin commented that light rail has hooks to hang your bicycle on.
- Thomas Martin asked if you put light rail down a median in the roadway how do you protect passengers getting on and off from the traffic.

Michael Wallwork responded that stops are at the far side of an intersection, which allows for passengers to enter and exit the light rail car safely.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 3:13 p.m. The next CAC meeting will be September 7, 2022.
