Chairman Rutkowski welcomed everyone and called the Technical Advisory Committee meeting to order at 10:11 a.m. Introductions were made around the room.

▶ D. RESOLUTION ADOPTING 2023 SAFETY PERFORMANCE TARGETS

Clark Letter informed the group that 23 CFR 490 requires the FDOT to adopt targets for number of fatalities, number of serious injuries, fatality rate, serious injury rate, total number of non-motorized fatalities and serious injuries. The North Florida TPO is also required to adopt performance targets for these measures and would like to adopt the FDOT's aspirational targets for safety.

Mr. Letter asked for questions. There were no questions at this time.

E. <u>LIST OF PRIORITY PROJECTS (LOPP) 2023</u>

Clark Letter informed the group that the List of Priority Projects (LOPP) is the TPO's task-based budget. This is a candidate list of projects for the new fifth year of FDOT's Five Year Work Program. Mr. Letter asked for the submittal of the initial priority projects no later than January 20, 2023. Staff anticipates having a first draft for the February meetings, with the expectation to adopt the LOPP in March.

Mr. Letter asked for questions. There were no questions at this time.

F. UNIFIED PLANNING WORK PROGRAM (UPWP) FY 2022/23 - 2023/24

Clark Letter informed the group that the Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) is the North Florida TPO's two-year planning and operational budget. This is an opportunity for citizens and/or public entities to submit their projects by January 20, 2023. Staff anticipates presenting a draft at the February meeting and taking action on a final list in March.

Mr. Letter asked for questions. There were no questions at this time.

G. SMART NORTH FLORIDA UPDATE

Clayton Levins gave the following update.

- Developing the 2022 Impact Report and anticipate presenting at the February meeting.
- SNF has joined the COJ's Resilient Working Group, led by COJ's Chief Resiliency Officer, Ann Coglianese. The group consists of public and private entities and allows for regional collaborative opportunities.
- The University of Florida students will give their final presentations Friday on their data analytics projects.
- SNF has partnered with the City of St. Augustine to deploy Spot Parking. This application allows the user via a web interface to see the location and availability

of parking spots. A Spot Parking representative will be presenting to the TPO Board at tomorrow's meeting.

 Reuben Franklin commented that he is excited to see the results of the pilot program.

H. OLD BUSINESS

I. NEW BUSINESS

- Elections of officers and approval of the October minutes will take place at the February meeting, due to the absence of a quorum in December.
- Clean Fuels The NEVI federal program is anticipated to bring \$190-\$200 million into the State of Florida. The program will consist of a two-phased approach. Phase One will focus on meeting the federal requirements for electric vehicle chargers every fifty (50) miles on the interstate. The state has created an initial plan for that. Fifteen locations within the State of Florida to meet the requirements, four in District 2, and two within the TPO's boundary. One at 301 and I-10 and somewhere in St. Johns County (SR 210 or SR 206). Phase Two does not have a timeline and deals with the arterial systems. The TPO is more interested in Phase 2, as it effects more of our community.
- Justin Ryan wanted to know if this program is only for personal vehicles.

Mr. Sheffield responded that it is for personal vehicles and trucks. The amount of electricity that is needed to operate these chargers is a heavy lift. The problem is how to get that electric capacity to the charger.
