CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Companion welcomed everyone and called the Technical Advisory Committee meeting to order at 10:01 a.m. Introductions were made around the room.

PUBLIC COMMENT

None at this time.

A. APPROVE THE OCTOBER 2, 2024 MEETING MINUTES

Chairman Companion asked that the October Technical Advisory Committee meeting minutes be approved.

Doug Conkey moved to approve the October 2, 2024 meeting minutes; Stephen Smith seconded; motion unanimously carried.

B. **ELECTING OFFICERS**

Chairman Companion opened the floor for nominations for Chairman. Reuben Franklin nominated Jason Sparks, who accepted the nomination. The Chair asked for any other nominations. Seeing none, Chairman Companion moved to close the nominations for Chairman; seconded by Doug Conkey; motion unanimously carried. Jason Sparks will be the 2025 TAC Chairman.

Chairman Companion opened the floor for nominations for Vice Chairman. Doug Conkey nominated Stephen Smith, who accepted the nomination. The Chair asked for any other nominations. Seeing none, Chairman Companion moved to close the nominations for Vice Chairman; seconded by Reuben Franklin; motion unanimously carried. Stephen Smith will be the 2025 TAC Vice Chairman.

C. RESOLUTION ADOPTING 2025 SAFETY PERFORMANCE TARGETS

Clark Letter informed the group the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) published several rules establishing performance measures and reporting requirements for State Departments of Transportation (DOTs) and Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs). These rules establish measures to assess the condition of road safety within MPO boundaries. FDOT annually establishes statewide safety targets applicable to all public roads regardless of functional classification or ownership. MPOs have the option of supporting the statewide targets or establishing their own for the MPO planning area. The TPO supports FDOT's statewide targets.

Mr. Letter asked for questions.

- Doug Conkey commented a goal of zero is an unrealistic goal and he prefers a vision of zero. The goals should be set in the various areas FDOT oversees.
 - Mr. Letter responded we recognize these are aspirational targets. FDOT's motivation is anything other than zero fatalities is unacceptable.
 - Mr. Sheffield commented the challenge is if the TPO set its own targets we would have the responsibility of directly affecting those targets. It would be difficult as we do not build or implement any projects.
- Richard Smith agrees with Mr. Conkey that a zero target is not practical. Mr. Smith suggested a five percent reduction year over year for the next five years.
 - Mr. Sheffield responded this remains a constant conversation.

Elizabeth Backe moved to adopt the 2025 Safety Performance Targets; Doug Conkey seconded; motion unanimously carried.

D. <u>FDOT REQUESTS AMENDING THE FY 2024/25 – FY 2028/29</u> TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP)

Reuben Franklin moved to approve the FDOT's request to amend the FY 2024/25 – FY 2028/29 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP); Michael Grunwald seconded; motion unanimously carried.

E. LIST OF PRIORITY PROJECTS (LOPP)

Clark Letter informed the group staff is soliciting projects for the annual List of Priority Projects (LOPP). This is a candidate list of projects for the new fifth year of the Florida Department of Transportation's Five Year Work Program. Please submit your initial priority projects no later than January 24, 2025. We understand that formal approval by your county commission or council may take longer, but this request will enable TPO staff to prepare a first draft of the LOPP for the February 6 committee and Board meetings. Our expectation will be to adopt the LOPP in March.

Mr. Letter asked for questions.

 Doug Conkey wanted to know if resiliency could be added into the description relative to impacts at the local level.

Mr. Letter responded we can do that as part of the LRTP. We have flagged those projects that have resilient components or those that were affected by flood waters and sea level rise.

F. <u>UNIFIED PLANNING WORK PGORAM (UPWP) FY 2025/26 SPECIAL STUDIES</u>

Clark Letter informed the group the Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) is the North Florida Transportation Planning Organization's (TPO's) two-year tasked based budget. Bi-annually, TPO staff updates the UPWP as required by state and federal regulations. The UPWP outlines all major transportation planning activities undertaken by the TPO for the two-year planning period beginning July 1, 2024 and ending June 30, 2026.

There has been one change relative to the transportation alternatives process. In the past we have had two separate categories, multi-use trails and Safe Routes to Schools sidewalks. These categories are now combined.

The North Florida TPO is requesting studies to consider for FY 2025/26. These projects will be located in Section 5 – Special Projects section of the UPWP and are executed by a TPO General Consultant.

Mr. Letter asked for questions.

• Jeff Sheffield informed the group we do not need a scope or cost estimate at this time. Please just submit five sentences briefly describing the project.

- Doug Conkey wanted to know what a typical study request is.
 - Mr. Sheffield responded it is now very broad. We have done truck delivery, gate optimization, corridor, ITS and stormwater studies.
- Doug Conkey wanted to know if traffic calming would be eligible.

Mr. Sheffield responded near the city hall in Atlantic Beach we are funding an effort to look at a non-traditional roundabout for traffic calming.

G. FDOT ANNUAL WORK PROGRAM PRESENTATION

Victoria Kutney gave a brief presentation on FDOT's Annual Work Program.

Ms. Kutney asked for questions.

- Doug Conkey asked if FDOT would consider additional scope on a project if the county requests it.
 - Ms. Kutney responded FDOT will accept requests; however, there is no guarantee they can accommodate it.
- Richard Smith commented in terms of projects we do not get notice so we can comment or request additional scope or changes.
 - Mr. Sheffield commented we now have the ability to look online for all information and timelines regarding the projects.
- Doug Conkey wanted to know if all five years of the projects in the work program are funded.
 - Mr. Sheffield responded all the projects within the work program are funded but not through construction.
- Doug Conkey asked if landscaping are specific asks by the local governments.
 - Ms. Kutney responded it varies and is on a case-by-case basis.

H. <u>SMART NORTH FLORIDA</u>

Matt Brooker from Automotus gave a brief presentation on the St. Augustine Curb Analytics pilot project.

Mr. Brooker asked for questions.

• Reuben Franklin commented Automotus and SNF are great to work with. Clayton Levins managed and ran the pilot and it worked out well.


