►C. RESOLUTION ADOPTING 2026 SAFETY PERFORMANCE TARGETS

Clark Letter informed the group the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) published several rules establishing performance measures and reporting requirements for State Departments of Transportation (DOTs) and Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs). These rules establish measures to assess the condition of road safety within MPO boundaries.

FDOT annually establishes statewide safety targets for the following calendar year as part of the HSIP Annual Report, which must be submitted by August 31 each year. Targets are applicable to all public roads regardless of functional classification or ownership.

MPOs have the option of supporting the statewide targets or establishing their own targets for the MPO planning area. MPOs must set their targets within 180 days after FDOT sets the statewide targets. MPOs must annually update their targets by February 27 of each year.

Mr. Letter asked for questions. There were no questions at this time.

Christine Hoffman moved to approve the 2026 Safety Performance Targets; Jimmy Peluso seconded; motion unanimously carried.

►D. <u>SMART NORTH FLORIDA UPDATE</u>

Brian Glazer, CEO of Hohonu, gave a brief presentation on hyperlocal flood intelligence.

Mr. Glazer asked for questions. There were no questions at this time.

►E. SR 105 (HECKSCHER DRIVE) CORRIDOR STUDY PRESENTATION

Martha Moore and Ryan Thady gave a brief presentation on the SR 105 Heckscher Drive Corridor Study.

Ms. Moore asked for questions.

• James Bennett thanked the TPO for funding this study as well as the Benesch team for conducting this study.

F. BEST FOOT FORWARD PROGRAM LAUNCH

Thalia Fuste presented the Best Foot Forward program that will be done by Bike/Walk Central Florida.

Ms. Fuste asked for questions.

- Joe Carlucci commented a significant number of people are getting hit and are not in the crosswalk. He feels enforcement needs to be centered around pedestrians not crossing in a crosswalk.
- Joe Carlucci asked when monitoring the crosswalk, will you monitor 100 feet in both directions.

Ms. Fuste responded we will study the entire area to see if the crosswalk is in the wrong location and how we could add an additional crosswalk.

Joe Carlucci asked if there is going to be priority for school crossings.
 What type of awareness will be done for pedestrians, so they safely cross our roadways?

Ms. Fuste responded each county will decide; however, we are prioritizing looking at school crossings.

 Jeff Sheffield commented this is a turn-key pilot program that will look at various locations of our choosing. We will share the results and updates throughout the process.

H. <u>SECRETARY OF TRANSPORTATION'S REPORT</u>

I. AUTHORITY REPORTS

Patricia Gillum Sams – Jacksonville Transportation Authority – JTA has relaunched its popular Gameday Xpress service for the 2025 Jaguars football season. This service continues to be the best way for fans to get to EverBank Stadium quickly, easily, and affordably, ensuring fans have a convenient option for attending home games skipping the hassle of traffic and parking. On average we serve between 2,000 – 3,000 customers per home game. During the Jacksonville Jaguars vs. Kansas City Chiefs game on Monday, October 6th, JTA transported 3,424 passengers.

Last week marked an important milestone for the JTA as we introduced contactless payment on the NAVI autonomous shuttle. Starting October 1, customers can now board by tapping a credit card or mobile wallet to pay the \$1.75 fare. This advancement not only makes travel easier, safer, and more convenient, but also reflects the JTA's broader commitment to innovation and customer-focused mobility solutions.

The JTA hosted the Skyway Social on October 4, a unique event that transformed our Skyway stations into vibrant hubs of music, art, and community. Riders moved between Kings Avenue, San Marco, and Central Stations to experience live performances, DJs, and local food and culture. The event showcased the Skyway in an exciting new way, highlighting its role not just as a mode of transit, but as a platform for community connection and innovation in Downtown Jacksonville. The JTA's NAVI and HOLON vehicles were also on display during this event highlighting our new autonomous service through our downtown core.

As a continuation of our latest round of service enhancements implemented on September 8, JTA intends to introduce additional service improvements in January 2026. These enhancements will include frequency increases, running

time adjustments, and schedule changes on select routes to improve reliability, reduce wait times, and better align service with customer demand.

James Bennett (for Tom Slater) – JAXPORT – By the time we meet again, JAXPORT will have reached several milestones.

Two new container cranes that arrived over the summer will be fully assembled and moved to the rails at Blount Island, preparing us to move cargo more efficiently and keep up with growing customer demand.

Southeast Toyota Distributors will have completed processing its first vessel at its new, state-of-the-art facility at Blount Island — an important step forward in strengthening Jacksonville's role as a hub for automotive logistics.

These two initiatives were accomplished with assistance from the Florida Department of Transportation! We greatly appreciate the continued support.

On the cruise side, we'll celebrate the inaugural sailing of the Norwegian Gem, which launches seasonal cruise service from Jacksonville on Halloween. We're also proud to share that Carnival Elation was recently ranked second in guest satisfaction among Carnival's 29-ship fleet. That recognition is especially meaningful because it comes directly from passenger feedback.

Even with a busy summer season and higher passenger volumes, Jacksonville's boarding experience scored among the best in the fleet — a reflection of the teamwork between JAXPORT, our cruise partners, and the many local workers who make these sailings possible.

Staff is soliciting projects for the annual List of Priority Projects (LOPP). This is a candidate list of projects for the new fifth year of the Florida Department of Transportation's Five Year Work Program. Please submit your initial priority projects no later than **January 23, 2026**. We understand that formal approval by your county commission or city council may take longer, but this request will enable TPO staff to prepare a first draft of the LOPP for the February round of committee and Board meetings. Our expectation will be to adopt the LOPP in March.

The LOPP document includes the following categories of projects:

Region-Wide Priority Projects – Transportation Capacity Projects

This list is perhaps the most important. This list of 25 projects represents the larger capacity and high priority projects throughout the TPO area. This list does not change substantially from year to year, as projects are typically only removed from the list when construction funding has been programmed.

Aviation Priority Projects

Jacksonville Aviation Authority and St. Augustine - St. Johns County Airport Authority can each submit a list of its priorities for inclusion in the document. The TPO includes these as a reference, but does not re-prioritize these projects.

Mass Transit Priorities

Jacksonville Transportation Authority and St. Johns/Sunshine Bus can each submit a list of its priorities for inclusion in the document. The TPO includes these as a reference, but does not re-prioritize these projects.

Port Priority Projects

JAXPORT and the Ocean Highway & Port Authority of Nassau County can each submit a list of its priorities for inclusion in the document. The TPO includes these as a reference, but does not re-prioritize these projects.

Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) – Multi-Use Trails or Sidewalks

TAP projects are funded on a rotational basis by County. Our estimated total TAP funding of \$3M will be split to fund two different Counties at approximately \$1.5M each. We are asking that each county please submit two TAP projects to provide a backup in case any issues arise with the first project submission.

SUN Trail Program – Multi-Use Trails

It is especially critical that each county submit one viable project for each of the TAP and SUN Trail Programs. <u>Cost estimates must be provided</u>. It is recommended you revisit the project submitted annually to ensure it is still feasible. Applications must be submitted through the GAP system. Please submit the entire trail to our list broken into fundable segments, and indicate the priority of each segment.

• Transportation Regional Incentive Program Priorities

Transportation Regional Incentives Program (TRIP) priorities reflect the region-wide priority list.

Again, please submit your initial priority projects no later than January 23, 2026.

The North Florida TPO and the Florida Department of Transportation are seeking study requests for the 2026/27 fiscal year.
