CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Sam Newby called the meeting to order at 10:02 a.m. James Bennett led the Invocation and the Pledge of Allegiance.

PUBLIC COMMENT

None at this time.

CONSENT AGENDA

▶1. NORTH FLORIDA TPO MINUTES OF NOVEMBER 10, 2021

Nancy Sikes-Kline moved to approve the Consent Agenda; Kristen Burke seconded; motion unanimously carried.

AGENDA

► A. FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

Representing the Finance Committee, Angela Session reported that the October financials have been accepted.

Audit Presentation

Mary Ann Magers of Magers & Associates, LLC presented the audit for the year ending June 30, 2021.

Ms. Magers asked for questions. There are no questions at this time.

TPO Employee Bonuses

Mr. Sheffield informed the Board that staff is requesting the Board authorize \$70,109.37 to be used to award a one-time bonus to TPO employees in lieu of salary increases. This request results in no negative impact to any projects in the TPO's UPWP. The funding would come from savings realized through staff attrition and reorganization resulting in a net annual reduction in recurring overhead of 11.2% for a total of \$125,712.39.

The decision to award one-time bonuses in lieu of salary increases insures that our overhead remains lower and prepares us for potential healthcare premium increases anticipated in the future. As one of the few organizations that did not receive Cares Act Relief funding, we have managed to weather the COVID storm within our existing budgets and ultimately strengthen our financial position going forward.

Mr. Sheffield asked for questions.

• Randy White wanted to know if the bonuses would be reflected in the employee's pension.

Mr. Sheffield responded that there are only two employees currently enrolled in the City's pension program. The rest of the employees are enrolled in FRS. The bonus will not be reflected in the employee's pension.

Randy DeFoor commented that she likes the one-time bonus because it will not increase the TPO's liability as it pertains to the pension.

Nancy Sikes-Kline moved to approve the request to authorize \$70,109.37 to be used to award a one-time bonus to TPO employees in lieu of salary increases; Randy DeFoor seconded; motion unanimously carried.

▶B. <u>ELECTING OFFICERS</u>

Chairman Newby stated that according to the TPO Bylaws officers shall be elected at the December meeting by majority vote of the voting members present, and their terms become effective at the first meeting of the new calendar year.

Chairman Newby opened the floor for nominations for Chairman. Nancy Sikes-Kline nominated Wayne Bolla, who accepted the nomination. Chairman Newby asked for any other nominations. Seeing none, Chairman Newby moved to close the nominations for Chairman; Thomas Ford seconded; motion unanimously carried. Wayne Bolla will be the 2022 Chairman for the TPO.

Chairman Newby opened the floor for nominations for Vice Chairman. Thomas Ford nominated Mike Cole, who accepted the nomination. Chairman Newby asked for any other nominations. Seeing none, Chairman Newby moved to close the nominations for Vice Chairman; Randy DeFoor seconded; motion unanimously carried. Mike Cole will be the 2022 Vice Chairman for the TPO.

Chairman Newby opened the floor for nominations for Treasurer. Randy White nominated Christian Whitehurst, who accepted the nomination. Chairman Newby asked for any other nominations. Seeing none, Chairman Newby moved to close the nominations for Treasurer; Thomas Ford seconded; motion unanimously carried. Christian Whitehurst will be the 2022 Treasurer for the TPO.

Chairman Newby thanked the Board for their support during his tenure as Chairman.

C. <u>JTA REQUESTS AMENDING THE FY 2021/22 THROUGH FY 2025/26</u> TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP)

Richard Clark presented the following amendment to the Transportation Improvement Program for FY 2021/22 through FY 2025/26.

• FM #435741-2 – 2021 Federal Lands Access Program (FLAP) Grant

Mr. Clark asked for questions.

Randy DeFoor wanted to know the dollar amount of the request.

Mr. Clark responded that this is a grant totaling \$1.4 million along with our local match for a total of \$1.8 million. The money will be used to upgrade the restrooms to be ADA compliant, improve queuing, and upgrade the parking and bike areas.

Randy DeFoor moved to approve the JTA's request to amend the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for FY 2021/22 through FY 2025/26; Ari Jolly seconded; motion unanimously carried.

D. <u>A1A SPEED DESIGN CORRIDOR STUDY</u>

Wiley Page of Atkins gave a brief presentation on the A1A Speed Design Corridor Study.

Mr. Page asked for questions.

Mike Cole wanted to know the speed limit of the roundabout.

Mr. Page responded that it would be 20 - 25 m.p.h.

- Nancy Sikes-Kline commented that the City of St. Augustine has benefitted over the years from the TPO doing these types of studies on our behalf. This process sparks innovative ideas and creativity on how to address transportation issues.
- Randy DeFoor wanted to know if noise barriers have been considered on these projects.

Mr. Sheffield responded that typically the noise would come from the interstate and not an arterial. In this context, noise barriers would not be considered.

Secretary Evans commented that speed reduction results in noise reduction.

E. ANASTASIA BOULEVARD COMPLETE STREETS CORRIDOR STUDY

Wiley Page of Atkins gave a brief presentation on the Anastasia Boulevard Complete Streets Corridor Study.

Mr. Page asked for questions. There are no questions at this time.

F. SMART NORTH FLORIDA UPDATE

Clayton Levins gave the following update.

 Smart Regions Zone legislation will allow four or more contiguous counties to designate a Center of Excellence to deploy funding from Enterprise Florida directly related to technology projects that would innovate public sector processes spread across the entire smart region zone. We now have SB 1098 and HB 835.

G. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Jeff Sheffield provided the following updates:

- TPO Legislative Policy Position cards are available for your use.
- We did not receive the federal RAISE Grant for the Smart St. Augustine project; however, the \$7.5 million dollars in local match will remain in the work program.
- Jeff Sheffield informed the group that today is Denise Bunnewith's last day. Denise is retiring after 32 years of service.

H. SECRETARY OF TRANSPORTATION'S REPORT

Secretary Evans informed the Board that several years ago FDOT began downsizing its workforce. The primary focus was to eliminate positions associated with equipment operators, mowing crews, concrete crews and bridge tenders. We outsourced to maintenance contractors. On a Friday afternoon in early November, DBI, one of our major maintenance contractors, went out of business without our knowledge. FDOT is now back in the maintenance business.

 Randy DeFoor commented that four percent of the infrastructure bill is going to Florida. Based on our population, that is not acceptable. Ms. DeFoor wanted to know if there was anything that can be done for Florida to get a bigger percentage.

Secretary Evans responded that we first have to see what the language will be in the bill. Once we know the language, we can come up with a strategy to move forward.

J. AUTHORITY REPORTS

James Bennett – JAXPORT – Eleven additional container ships are now utilizing JaxPort in an effort to alleviate the congestion and keep goods coming into the country. We recently launched a multi-year partnership with the Jacksonville University's Marine Science Institute to raise awareness to protect the St. Johns River. Carnival Cruise line will resume service in March.

Mike Cole – Nassau County Ocean Highway and Port Authority – Tonnage has increased over the last year. Our port attorney has agreed to stay.

Ari Jolly – Jacksonville Transportation Authority – The U.S. Department of Transportation has awarded the JTA a \$1.72 million grant from the RAISE grant program to support the third phase of the U²C. The RAISE grant program, which stands for Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity, is the successor to the BUILD grant program. Projects for RAISE funding were evaluated based on merit criteria that include safety, environmental sustainability, quality of life, economic competitiveness, state of good repair, innovation, and

partnership. The RAISE grant will help us advance planning, environmental, and preliminary project development activities and position the JTA to pursue FTA Capital Improvement Grants (CIG) and/or other U.S. Department of Transportation competitive discretionary grant funding for design and construction of Phase III of the U²C project.

The JTA Holiday Bus is back for the 2021 holiday season. Bus riders across Jacksonville can enjoy Christmas music and holiday decorations on the bus, which will be free to customers and feature a custom bus wrap with Santa at the wheel. The Holiday Bus will run on a different JTA bus route every weekday until January 2.

Reba Ludlow, St. Augustine–St. Johns County Airport Authority – Elite Service operates on Monday and Friday from Jacksonville to Newark. Facility improvements are ongoing.

Matt Schellhorn – U.S. Navy Representative (for Captain Jeff Hill) – Thanked RS&H and Ms. Bunnewith for the A-1-A Study. Tritan aircraft will be arriving in Mayport this month. NAS Jax will conduct an exercise in January. The air show will resume in October 2022.

1. LIST OF PRIORITY PROJECTS (LOPP)

Staff is soliciting projects for the annual List of Priority Projects (LOPP). This is a candidate list of projects for the new fifth year of the FDOT's Five Year Work Program. Please submit your initial priority projects no later than January 21, 2022. This will enable TPO staff to prepare a first draft of the LOPP for the February meetings. The expectation will be to adopt the LOPP in March.

2. UNIFIED PLANNING WORK PROGRAM (UPWP)

The UPWP is the TPO's two-year task based budget. Bi-annually, the staff updates the UPWP as required by state and federal regulation. The UPWP outlines all major transportation planning activities to be undertaken by the TPO for the two-year planning period beginning July 1, 2022 and ending June 30, 2024.

Staff is requesting studies for possible inclusion in the FY 2022/23 through FY 2023/24 UPWP no later than December 31. These projects are located in Section 5 – Special Projects section of the UPWP, and are executed by a TPO General Consultant.

M. PUBLIC COMMENT

• Doug Conkey thanked Ms. Bunnewith for her hard work and dedication over the years, and wished her well in her retirement.

Mr. Conkey informed the group that the St. Johns River Water Management District has waived fees on capping unused or abandoned artesian wells.

OVERVIEW

The North Florida Transportation Planning Organization (North Florida TPO) Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for Fiscal Years 2023/2024 through 2027/2028 begins with preparing a "List of Priority Projects" to be used in developing the Florida Department of Transportation's (FDOT) Tentative Five Year Work Program. The "List of Priority Projects" identifies potential projects to be funded in the new fifth year (2027/2028) of the FDOT Work Program. However, by creating the Strategic Intermodal System (SIS) and the Transportation Regional Incentive Program (TRIP) in Florida, the "List of Priority Projects" now includes potential projects to be funded in other years of the FDOT Work Program under the SIS and TRIP programs. The "List of Priority Projects" includes a prioritized listing of state highway, mass transit, aviation, intermodal, and Transportation Alternative Program (TAP) and Transportation Regional Incentive Program (TRIP) projects*.

The North Florida TPO expects all projects currently programmed in the FDOT Work Program to advance to the next development phase. This will ensure that implementing the 3-C planning process (continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive) in the North Florida TPO area is being implemented, as required by federal and state statutes. If FDOT cannot complete the programmed phase and advance the project to the next logical phase, it is incumbent that the agency provides an explanation to the North Florida TPO.

1	JAX-Concourse B Replacement \$233,000,000 The Jacksonville International Airport (JAX) Concourse B Replacement includes design and construction of a six-gate concourse, associated ramp area, and the relocation of Taxiway V. The concourse will consist of up to three levels with approximately 165,000 total square feet and includes the development of holdrooms, aircraft gates, concession space, restrooms, and a connecting corridor with moving sidewalks.
2	JAX-Cargo Apron Expansion \$2,500,000 This project will expand the existing Air Cargo apron by adding 7000 square yards of concrete apron to the southern side of the existing apron. The existing air cargo apron is located north of runway 14/32 and south of the terminal structure. This project is necessary to accommodate increased air cargo operations and larger cargo aircraft.
3	JAX-Wetland Mitigation \$13,500,000 This project will be the removal and mitigation of jurisdictional wetlands deemed Hazardous Wildlife Habitat for JIA. The proposed area is 166.59 acres in size and lies within the AOA, directly northeast of RWY 8/26.
4	Cecil-Approach Road Utilities & Roadway \$20,000,000 The Approach Road Utilities & Roadway project supports the construction of a two-lane road and associated common use utilities within the boundary of Cecil Airport and Cecil Spaceport. The ultimate construction of the road will serve as the common use roadway link connecting the common use Spaceport Operations Area to other aerospace development and public use areas.
5	Cecil-Runway 18R/36L Rehabilitation \$8,500,000 This project will rehabilitate the portions of the asphalt on RWY 18R/36L. This project will include the design and construction of the Runway 18L/36R asphalt keel reconstruction. The project abuts the concrete section of Runway 18L and is 500' in length by 50' in width. The existing pavement consists of 4.5" of asphalt pavement over 9" of lime rock base. The anticipated new pavement section consists of 12" of compacted subgrade, 8" of lime rock base, and 9" of asphalt pavement.
6	Spaceport-Payload Prep Facility \$2,000,000 Payload processing is an integral part of Commercial Space Operations. Currently, a Payload preparation facility is not available at Cecil Spaceport and processing is completed through the modification of existing facilities to meet the needs of individual launch providers and specific payloads.

7 Spaceport-Rocket Motor Test Facility \$1,000,000

The design and construction of the Rocket Motor & Vehicle Testing Facility will include the development of a concrete pad accompanied by a control room and propellant and oxidizer storage facility dimensioned according to a baseline rocket engine group determined by the Facility Requirements Evaluation. Required

utilities will include electric, fiber and plumbed to eventually connect water for fire suppression. The facility will be designed taking into consideration propellant combinations, thrust levels and engine types as well as setback distances to comply with FAA Explosive Siting Criteria.
