▶D. RESOLUTION ADOPTING SAFETY PERFORMANCE TARGETS

Denise Bunnewith informed the Board that 23 USC 23 CFR 490 requires the FDOT to adopt targets for *number of fatalities, number of serious injuries, fatality rate, serious injury rate, total number of non-motorized fatalities and serious injuries.* The North Florida TPO is also required to adopt performance targets for these measures and would like to adopt the FDOT's aspirational targets for safety.

Ms. Bunnewith asked for questions. There were no questions at this time.

Bill Killingsworth moved to adopt the Safety Performance Targets; Reuben Franklin seconded; motion unanimously carried.

E. RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE JACKSONVILLE TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY'S (JTA) 2021 SAFETY PERFORMANCE TARGETS FOR TRANSIT SERVICES

Denise Bunnewith informed the Board that 49 CFR Part 673 requires the JTA to adopt transit safety performance targets for *number of fatalities, number of fatalities per 100,000 (100k) vehicle road miles (VRM); injuries, injuries per 100k VRM; safety events, safety events per 100k VRM; and system reliability.* The North Florida TPO is also required to adopt annual performance targets for these measures and would like to adopt JTA's annual performance targets for transit services.

Ms. Bunnewith asked for questions.

 Bill Mann wanted to know if we can assume that the 63 injuries related to bus transit is a reduction over the last couple of years.

Ms. Bunnewith responded that is correct. JTA will have to collect data to show the actual number of injuries.

Bill Killingsworth moved to adopt the Safety Performance Targets for transit services; Bill Mann seconded; motion unanimously carried.

F. RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE SUNSHINE BUS COMPANY'S 2021 SAFETY PERFORMANCE TARGETS

Denise Bunnewith informed the Board that 49 CFR Part 673 requires Sunshine Bus Company to adopt transit safety performance targets for *number of fatalities*, *number of fatalities per 100,000 (100k) vehicle road miles (VRM); injuries, injuries per 100k VRM; safety events, safety events per 100k VRM; and system reliability.* The North Florida TPO is also required to adopt annual performance targets for these measures and would like to adopt the Sunshine Bus Company's annual performance targets for transit services.

Ms. Bunnewith asked for questions. There were no questions at this time.

Reuben Franklin moved to adopt the Safety Performance Targets for transit services; Bill Killingsworth seconded; motion unanimously carried.

Autumn Martinage presented the amendment to the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for FY 2020/21 through FY 2024/25 for approval.

Ms. Martinage informed the CAC that SR 228 from Yellow Water Road to North of Solomon Road is already in the TIP; therefore, it is being removed.

Richard Clark presented the amendment to the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for FY 2020/21 through FY 2024/25 for approval.

Bill Mann moved to approve the JTA's request to amend the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for FY 2020/21 through FY 2024/25; Bill Killingsworth seconded; motion unanimously carried.

I. REVISED TCC BYLAWS

Beth Payne informed the group that there are minor changes to the bylaws. The changes are as follows:

- Change the name from Technical Coordinating Committee (TCC) to Technical Advisory Committee (TAC).
- The Keystone Heights Airport Authority has been added.
- The school boards from Nassau, Duval, Clay and St. Johns counties have been added.

Ms. Payne asked for questions.

- Bill Killingsworth suggested that the Vice Chair also serve as the "Floor Leader", which would help move the meetings along. The "Floor Leader" would make the motion to move an item, and then discussion should follow after the item is seconded. If the Vice Chair is unavailable, then we could move to the third year member.
- Jeff Sheffield commented that he does not have any objection to a "Floor Leader".
- James Richardson commented that he supports the concept, but cautions the group. Bylaws are meant to be long lasting. If this does not work, then you will need to go through the process of changing the bylaws. Mr. Richardson suggests that we adopt it as a meeting procedure.
- Bill Killingsworth wanted to know how often we review the bylaws.

Marci Larson responded that the bylaws are reviewed every two years.

- Lynn Rutkowski commented that she would be in favor of appointing someone as "Floor Leader".
- Reuben Franklin wanted to know if the second to last bullet is a comment or a change to the bylaws.

Ms. Rutkowski responded that it is a comment.

Mr. Sheffield responded that the problem is there are some less than intuitive agencies built into the membership, and we cannot remove the agency. It is hard to get participation.

Bill Killingsworth moved to amend the draft bylaws to include the duties of "Floor Leader" to be assigned to the Vice Chair and with the Chair appointing a "Floor Leader" in the absence of the Vice Chair; Bill Mann seconded; motion unanimously carried.

▶ J. SMART NORTH FLORIDA UPDATE

- The 2.0 version of the dashboard will be out soon. We are moving towards real-time data sets in various demographic areas.
- We maintain four general planning consultant contracts, and are working to standardize their activities. For most of our planning studies, the data collection component is included. The goal is for us to maintain these data sets within the data exchange. We envision providing the data sets

to our consultants so they would operate from a continuity standpoint. In turn, the funding used on data collection could then be used to fund analysis and evaluation efforts.

 Suraya Teeple suggested that we engage with local universities to develop applications from data for the region and hold a contest with prizes.

Mr. Sheffield responded that we have been doing that, and we anticipate getting more consistent with our Hack-a-Thons.

►K. OLD BUSINESS

None at this time.

►L. NEW BUSINESS

There is no expectation that the virtual meetings will continue after October; therefore, November's meeting will be a hybrid meeting. We will need between 6-8 in-person participants. The remaining members can vote and participate virtually. An action must be taken at the beginning of the meeting to allow those participating virtually to vote.

The TCC Bylaws committee, comprised of Lynn Rutowski, James Richardson, Colin Moore and myself, offer the following final changes to the TCC Bylaws based on our committee work and comments during the October TCC meeting:

- Change the committee name from Technical Coordinating Committee to Technical Advisory Committee. This change will better illustrate the name used by most MPOs.
- The Keystone Heights Airport Authority has been added as an agency that may send a representative.
- The rotation chart for chair/vice chair in Section 8: Electing officers on page 4 has been updated through 2028.
- Some time ago the Nassau County school board asked for representation, so
 efforts are underway to have representatives from Jacksonville/Duval, Clay and
 St. Johns Counties. These have been added to the agency list.
- We currently have several agencies/locales that are listed but do not send representatives. Staff outreaches to them periodically to secure representatives.
- The Vice Chair will serve as the floor leader during meetings, moving motions for a vote. (added to Section 7, #2 during the Oct. TCC meeting).
- Minor edits were completed.

Article I: Preamble

Preamble

The following sets forth the rules of Procedures and Bylaws of the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) of the North Florida Transportation Planning Organization (North Florida TPO).

Article II: Creation

Creation

The North Florida TPO shall appoint the TAC that includes City and County planners; engineers; representatives of local aviation authorities, port authorities, and public transit authorities; and other appropriate representatives of affected federal, state and local government agencies.

Article III: Responsibilities

Responsibilities

- 1. The TAC is created to assist the North Florida TPO in effectively managing a continuing, cooperative and comprehensive planning process that based upon prevailing principles, results in developing plans and programs which are consistent, to the maximum extent feasible, with the approved comprehensive plans of the local governments within the TPO's jurisdictional boundaries.
- 2. The TAC is the forum for cooperative decision-making by representatives of the affected governmental entities in developing plans and programs required by law.
- 3. The TAC is also the forum to disclose previously unidentified locally and privately funded transportation improvements of regional significance. Identified improvements shall be included in the conformity analysis for the Transportation Improvement Program and the Long Range Transportation Plan when appropriate.
- 4. Members of the TAC may request that items be placed on the TAC Agenda. The information must be provided to the TPO Staff no later than 12 calendar days prior to the meeting date. If extenuating circumstances exist, e.g., outside scheduling/deadline hardships arise, the Chairman may approve the addition of an item to the final agenda. For any item added to the final agenda, efforts will be made to provide the item to the TAC members prior to the meeting.

Each member is entitled to one vote. Absentee ballots shall not be allowed.

Section 2: Adding New Members/Agencies

An agency may be added to the voting governmental/agency membership of the TAC by approval of the TAC and of the North Florida TPO Board. Members from new governments/agencies, as well as new members replacing existing members, shall be appointed in writing by member governments and agencies. Notice shall be provided by the TPO Staff to the TAC and the North Florida TPO Board.

Section 3: Alternate Members

Alternates for voting members may be appointed and permitted to vote at meetings at which the regular members do not attend. An appointed alternate member must represent the same governmental entity or agency that the regular member serves. The designated governmental entity shall appoint the alternate member.

Section 4: Membership Term

A member shall serve at the will of the government entity or agency the member represents with no term limit.

Section 5: Terminating Membership

A member's term may be declared vacant by the North Florida TPO for either of the following causes:

- 1. The member is no longer employed by the agency/entity the member represents.
- 2. If an agency is not represented by the appointed member or alternate for three (3) consecutive meetings, the entity or agency represented by the member shall be contacted and asked to designate a new member and alternate.

Section 6: Resigning Membership

A member wishing to resign shall submit a resignation letter to the TAC Chair stating the effective date of such resignation.

Section 7: Officers

Officers of the TAC are Chair and Vice Chair.

- The Chair shall be elected and preside at all TAC meetings. The Chair shall appoint all subcommittee members and Chairs and shall have the authority to call special meetings or to cancel any regularly scheduled TAC meeting. The TAC Chair or designee shall attend TPO meetings and be available to answer questions.
- 2. The Vice Chair shall be elected, and during the absence of the Chair or the Chair's inability to serve, shall perform the duties as may be assigned by the TAC that are consistent with the Chair's authority. The Vice Chair will serve as the floor leader during the meetings, moving motions for a vote.

Section 8: Electing Officers

1. The Chair and Vice Chair's election shall be held at the last meeting of each calendar year and become effective at the first meeting of the new calendar year. The Chair shall represent an agency/entity within Jacksonville/Duval County and Clay, Nassau and St Johns Counties according to the schedule set forth in the table below. The Chair may serve no more than one consecutive term. The Vice Chair shall be from the county in the following year.

2. Vacancies for either office shall be filled by majority vote of the voting members present from the remaining TAC members for the term balance for said office.

Section 9: A Quorum of Voting Membership

The voting members present shall constitute a quorum. A simple majority of the voting members constituting the quorum shall be required to approve an item on the agenda.

Section 10: Establishing Committees

1. The Chair may establish committees on an as-needed basis.

2. The Chair will establish a Bylaws Committee at least every two years on evennumbered years to review the Bylaws and report their recommendations to the TAC.

Article V: Public Participation in TAC Meetings

Public Participation

Members of the public attending a TAC meeting have the opportunity to address the Committee. The TAC meeting agenda shall include an agenda item for the sole purpose of public participation. Should a member of the public request to speak during another TAC agenda item, s/he_may be allowed to do so at the Chair's discretion. Prior to addressing the TAC, all speakers must fill out a speaker's card. If the speaker is reading from a prepared text, a copy should be provided for the recording secretary.

The following standards shall be observed when a member of the public is addressing the Committee:

- 1. When called upon, the speaker should come promptly to the podium (if available), speak clearly into the microphone (if available), and state his/her name and address.
- 2. The speaker should identify the organization being represented, if any.
- 3. The speaker must limit remarks to three minutes, unless extended by the Chair.
- 4. The speaker may direct questions to the Chair only.
- 5. Members of the audience must refrain from audible comments and/or applause during the meeting. Under no circumstance may any audience member interrupt a speaker or otherwise attempt to intimidate or discourage a speaker from addressing the Committee through audible comments or noise making.
- 6. No speaker may indulge in personal attacks on any Committee or staff member(s). The Chair will revoke the speaker's privilege to address the Committee if this rule is violated.

Article VI: Administrative Services

Administrative Services

All general administrative services for the TAC shall be provided by the designated North Florida TPO staff members(s).

Article VII: General Information Concerning Agency

Location of Offices

The North Florida TPO is located at 980 North Jefferson Street, Jacksonville, Florida 32209. All North Florida TPO publications, forms and documents are available at this location from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, except holidays.
